


Paddington's Party







Paddington's Party Size 57 1/4" x 73 1/4"

Quilt Designed by Michele Scott Skill Level – Advanced Beginner

CUTTING:

From 20581-OB panel: Fussy cut twelve different 8 1/4" x 8 1/4" blocks. Be sure to leave the blue border around each block as you cut.

From 20517-O orange print: Twenty-four squares 6 3/8" x 6 3/8", cut in half diagonally to make forty-eight half square triangles.



From 20517-R red print: Ten strips 1 ¾" x WOF (width of fabric), six strips 1 ½" x WOF for inner borders, seven strips 2 ¼" x WOF for the inner border, two strips 1 ¾" x WOF for setting and corner triangles. Subcut into forty-two 1 ¾" squares.

From 20517-B blue print: Twelve strips 1 ¾" x WOF (width of fabric) for center checkerboards, side & setting triangles. Three strips 3" x WOF for setting and corner triangles. Subcut strips into thirty-one 3" x 3" squares. Cut each square diagonally twice to make 122 quarter-square triangles for the setting and corner triangles. Two squares 1 ¾" x 1 ¾". Cut squares in half diagonally to make four half-square triangles for the corners.


From 20585-Q aqua: Sixteen squares 4 ¼" x 4 ¼" for center checkerboards, setting and corner triangles. From 20585-O orange: Fourteen 4 ¼" x 4 ¼" squares for the center checkerboards, setting & corner triangles.

From 20585-B blue: Eighteen 4 ¼" x 4 ¼" squares for the center checkerboards, setting & corner triangles. From 20581-OB blocks: Seven strips 4 ½" x WOF for the outer border

SEWING:

Twelve Picture Blocks / Unfinished Size: 11 3/4" x 11

- Sew an orange half square triangle to each side of a panel block. Press.
- Sew the remaining half square triangles to the top and bottom of panel block to yield 12 blocks. Press.




Six Checkerboard Blocks / Unfinished Size: 11 3/4" x 11 3/4"


 Sew blue and red 1 3/4" strips together in the following manner. Press all seams towards to blue fabric.



2 Using a rotary cutter and ruler, cut 1 ¾" strips from sets.




Cut the following:



 Following the diagram, sew each set together to make 40 nine patch blocks. There will be 10 blocks left for setting triangles.



 Sew nine patch blocks to 4 ¼" Paddington print blocks. Make two each of the aqua, blue and orange for a total of six 11 ¾" blocks.



Make 2 of each block

Ten Checkerboard setting triangles:

 Sew two red/blue strip sets. Cut into 38 1 3/4" sections. There will be 8 sections used for the corner triangles. Make two sets



Sew a blue quarter-square triangle to the red end of each red/blue section, make 38. (Unit A)



 Sew a blue quarter-square triangle to adjoining sides of a red 1 ¼" x 1 ¾" square, make 38. (Unit B).




Sew units A & B together to make Unit C.



 Sew one checkerboard square, 2 Paddington print squares, and 3 unit C together. Make 4 blue, 3 aqua, 3 orange. There will be eight Unit C's left for corner triangles

Assembly for Corner Checkerboard triangles:


 Sew a blue quarter-square triangle to opposite sides of a 1 ¾" red square. Make 4



Sew a blue 1 ¾" triangle to the top of each red square to complete Unit D.




- Sew one Unit C to opposite sides of a 4 ¼" print square.
- Sew Unit D to the top of the 4 ¼" print square
 Make 2 with blue print and 2 aqua print 4 ½" squares.



Assembling the Top

- Following the placement below assemble 6 rows.
 As you sew checkerboard blocks to the picture blocks, press towards checkerboard blocks.
- Assemble rows.



- Sew all six red 1 ½" strips together end to end to produce one long 1 ½" strip.
- 4. Measure lengthwise though the center of the quilt and cut two strips this length. Sew to sides and press away from center. Measure the width of the quilt and cut two strips this length. Sew to top and bottom and press away from center.
- Sew all seven Paddington blocks print together end to end to produce one long 4 ½" strip.
- Measuring and sewing same as in step 4, add the 4 ½" borders.
- 7. Layer, baste, and quilt.
- 8. Bind with the remaining red fabric.
